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<p>Digital Clubbing</p>	<p>Caused by chronic hypoxemia (suggests a respiratory disease)</p> <p>Angle of nail bed increases (goes at a downward angle towards the end of finger, normal is straight)</p>
<p>Lateral Decubitus X ray</p>	<p>Used in diagnosing pleural effusions</p>

<p>Unilateral Wheeze</p>	<p>Foreign Body Obstruction (perform bronchoscopy)</p>
<p>Venous Vein Distention</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Occurs in CHF and COPD</li><li>● Occurs during exhalation</li></ul>
<p>Epiglottitis</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Potentially life threatening</li><li>● Swelling of supraglottic airway</li><li>● Seen on x ray as “thumb sign”</li><li>● Caused by a bacterial infection</li></ul>

Pulsus Paradoxus	BP ↑ and ↓ during inspiration and exhalation severe air trapping ex. Status asthmaticus
Orthopnea	Pt can't lay flat Occurs in CHF
Pulmozyme	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Dornase Alpha</li><li>● Commonly used in CHF patients</li><li>● Thins secretions</li><li>● Normal dose is 2.5 mg</li><li>● Requires refrigeration</li></ul>
